What about accessible parking?

The Act also states that **all** owners of buildings which the public uses must ensure that there are designated accessible parking spaces.

You must have a permit (or decal) to park in a designated space, or risk having your vehicle towed or clamped, and very soon you will also risk being ticketed and fined!



When is the deadline?

Section 21 of the **Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities) Act, 2014**, requires all buildings open to the public to be accessible. This Law is already in effect and the deadline for **ALL** buildings to fully comply is **31st December 2017.** If not, building owners may face enforcement or legal action.

Bahamas Building Code!

What does <u>Building Accessibility</u> mean?

It means that ...

persons with disabilities are able to access and use the features and spaces within the building, just like everyone else.

It means that ...

Entryways, exits, sidewalks, ramps, restrooms, lunchrooms and other common areas must be designed so that persons with disabilities can use them.

It means that ...

Buildings with more than one-storey must have elevators or lifts.

It means that ...

Reception, sales and service counters must be designed for access by persons with disabilities, including wheelchair users.

Accessible Parking must be designed to certain specifications. For more information, view the Commission's "Accessible
